This organization adds support to the Bloomer school district as it seeks to promote excellence in education. Many may know that this organization provides school supplies for all elementary and middle school students. They also have provided audio books to help improve literacy in addition to funding the high school for a special project: Fork Farms Flex Farm. The other recipient is Scenic Hills Youth Ranch. 

Call to Order - meeting was called to order at 6:12 pm by Dorene Turner, Council President.

#### **Town Hall Meetings**

- Question on preschool payroll increases when staff update credentials to qualify as lead teachers. Pastor will look into current pay amounts based on motion from October 2023. Council will get input from preschool committee, further discussion at May council meeting.
- Bass Guitar Discussion: A motion was made by Alicia Bonczyk to allow Camryn Yeakey to use the bass guitar at Luther Park this summer. # **Bishop Election Process**

## **BISHOP ELECTION PROCESS**

A few months ago, I found myself taking a new step that I never felt I'd take. On Thursday, Feb. 8, all seven conferences in the Northwest Synod of WI met separately in order to nominate candidates for the position of bishop of our synod. At our conference assembly, my name was brought forward for consideration. Previously, some close colleagues of mine spoke with me to see how I'd respond to a nomination, to which I normally responded, "We'll see what the Spirit has in mind!" Melinda and I have always had the practice of considering any call that comes our way, discerning whether or not we should pursue it. Never did I imagine discerning a call to be bishop until this year.

This is the first time our synod will be conducting the election process in this manner. Here are the steps:

- Conference Assemblies nominate candidates who are then contacted by the synod vice president to see if they will accept the nomination. 20 candidates were identified, seven of whom accepted the nomination.
- The ELCA runs a background check on all nominated candidates.
- Each candidate fills out a biographical information form to be released to the public.
- Each candidate records a three minute video to introduce themselves, also released to the public.

Three zoom forums are offered where each candidate receives five minutes to address preselected and known questions for those in attendance (April 28, May 2, and May 6).

These new steps are quite beneficial for synod assembly lay voting members so that they can have an idea of who the candidates are prior to the synod assembly. Previously, nominations didn't start until the first day of the synod assembly and voting members had essentially a 24 hour time period to get to know and elect the bishop.

At the synod assembly on June 7-8 at the UWEC Davies Center, the process continues as it used to.

First ballot - Nominations from the floor are accepted. 75% of the votes is needed for an election.

Second ballot - Top seven candidates advance. 75% is needed for an election.

Third ballot - Top five candidates advance. Two thirds is needed for an election.

Fourth ballot - Top three candidates advance. 60% is needed for an election.

Fifth ballot - Top two candidates advance. A majority is needed for an election.

Prior to each vote, candidates will speak to the assembly and address a pre-identified question unknown to them. Candidates will be separated from the assembly and will not know how the others responded. Each candidate will be with their assigned prayer partner. My prayer partner is Pastor Dale Chesley, who happens to be Melinda's uncle from Ashland!

I want you to know that I covet your prayers through this process. I have personally been praying for God's will to be done, believing that God knows what's best for this synod that I dearly love. If you have any questions about this process, I am more than happy to address them.
