THE WHOLENESS WHEEL Vocational Health

The resource that I've been utilizing to reference our complete health says the following with regard to our vocation:

We all have a calling - a vocation - to follow Christ's example by living a life of meaning, purpose, and service to our neighbor. Our vocations make up our life's work and passions - they are the everyday roles through which God calls us to help make this world a better place. Those who are vocationally well are faithful stewards of their talents and abilities, and find opportunities to build and use them.

This helps provide the framework to a good understanding of vocation, something that too many people confuse with our jobs. From my own personal standpoint, I feel fortunate to have a career that I truly feel called to that utilizes my God-given gifts. But I also recognize that there are many people out there making a living for themselves or their families out of a necessity to provide, even though their occupation may not necessarily be what they'd consider a calling.

The above description opens the doors to new and better understandings. A stay at home parent may not be employed, but could be exactly where God is calling them to be. Someone who is at the retirement stage in life is not necessarily done with a certain vocation. God may be calling them to something else besides their former employment, such as grandparenting or volunteer work!

When's the last time you took a good look at yourself to identify the gifts that God has offered to you? Would you consider your place of employment a calling or a job? Are you utilizing God's gifts there? Are you volunteering in places that you are passionate about that make your gifts shine?

I raise these very questions as I've faced them head on over the last year or so. When I was initially asked to consider the position of Bishop of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin, I laughed because I had a much different picture in my own mind of what gifts a bishop needs. I've personally served with seven different bishops in my 25 years of ministry. They have all left a large congregation or the synod office prior to being elected as bishop. That was my picture. But as I reconsidered what gifts a bishop should have from my own perspective, I realized that I had gifts to offer (administration, problem solving, deep listening, innovative thinking to name a few). Yes, those gifts are also used as a pastor as well, but rather than closing the door to a new calling, Melinda and I agreed that I would consider this call and see what happens.

Are you currently leading a fulfilling life, serving your neighbor in a way that utilizes your God-given gifts? Is this a source of health in your life? If not, what is getting in the way? If change is scary, I understand, trust me. But it might be exactly what God is leading you toward!
